MESSAGE FROM THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER

MUNICIPAL MANAGER OF LANGEBERG MUNICIPALITY: MR DP LUBBE

While I sit here writing the monthly editorial for the MM's corner, I cannot believe that the end of January 2026 already arrived. It was just the other day that we were planning for and managing the challenges during the Festive Season, and also had the privilege to spend valued time with our loved ones.

This time in the year is one of our busiest times during our financial year, as we are busy and involved in three financial years, being the previous 2024/25 financial year in terms of the Annual Report and the Annual Oversight Report, the present 2025/26 financial year in terms of the Mid-year Budget Review and Mid-year Performance Review, as well as the Adjustment Budget, and lastly the forthcoming future 2026/27 financial year, in terms of the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) Review and related Budget preparations.

For obvious reasons, the biggest priority on my mind, and the challenge that takes the most of our time, is the present challenge of water scarcity due to a combination of extremely high daily temperatures experienced, no daily rainfall, and an increase in consumption figures.

Already in October 2025, the Langeberg Municipal Council took note of the necessity to move from Level 1 water restrictions to Level 2 with effect from 1 December 2025. As management we held back, praying for rain to fall, as well as relying on our residents and communities to drastically reduce water consumption, as well as the municipality also playing its responsible role to effectively address water losses, and remained on level 1 for December 2025, as well as for January 2026, following a special SMT meeting on 30 December 2025.

However, we all know that we had no rainfall until now, coupled to an increase in consumption figures, during the December 2025/January 2026 period, partly also attributable to an increase in Tourists and visitors to our area. As a result, we had no choice but to move to level 2 water restrictions with effect from 1 February 2026, and I sincerely request our valued residents to please conserve water and use it as a valued scarce resource.

Please also note that the principle behind an increase in water tariffs under level 2, is not a punitive measure, or so called fine, but an increased tariff for utilizing more potable water as a scarce commodity.

There is however a separate fine to be imposed where transgressions are reported or witnessed in terms of level 2 prohibitions.

Another challenge that I wish to highlight is the continuous raging veld fires that we had to deal with over the past couple of months.

We all know that the dry temperatures and absence of rain contribute to the intensity and aggressiveness of veldfires, further exacerbated by windy conditions, and changes in wind directions. Just for the month of December 2025, our fire fighting personnel were involved in fighting more than eighty fires within the municipal area, this equates to an average of almost three fires per day, also remembering that this included the Festive Season. Notwithstanding the destruction caused by the fires, extinguishing such fires puts an astronomical demand on our scarce water resources.

I wish to make use of this opportunity to extend a big word of appreciation to our Langeberg Municipal Fire Services, each and every member of our fire fighters, the Cape Winelands District Municipality and its fire fighters, the Western Cape Provincial Disaster Management, as well as all volunteers and volunteer groups.

Also, a huge thank you to each individual, business and farming enterprise that came out during the raging fires to donate much needed fluids, energy drinks and food with nutritional value to our teams of fire fighters.

It is in times like these during severe challenges and adversity, that we witness how our local community pulls together as a united front. This is most commendable.

In closing, I wish to thank my fellow directors for always being available during the Festive Season, even while being on much deserved annual vacation leave to deal with service delivery challenges and emergencies and even being available during their vacation to have Teams-meetings to finalize urgent matters.

I wish all Langeberg residents and colleagues, a blessed and prosperous 2026, filled with abundant rain fall!

- Clear dry grass, weeds & debris
- Keep gutters clean
- Maintain 10m firebreaks around properties
- Never leave fires unattended

Remember: One small spark can become a major fire in minutes.

- Stay calm and evacuate early if needed
- Protect life first – property comes second
- Avoid smoke
- Keep access routes clear for emergency vehicles

May this season remind us of the importance of looking out for one another—checking in on our neighbours, caring for the elderly, and remembering the true meaning of community. Your actions during these fires have set an example for us all.

LEVEL 2 WATER RESTRICTIONS IMPLEMENTED ACROSS THE LANGEBERG MUNICIPAL AREA FROM 1 FEBRUARY 2026

Due to continued exceptionally low rainfall and increasing water consumption, dam levels across the Langeberg Municipal Area remain critically low. Despite ongoing public appeals to reduce water usage, overall consumption continues to rise. Combined with unpredictable rainfall patterns and high summer temperatures, the risk of water shortages has intensified.

To safeguard limited water resources and ensure water security and long-term sustainability, Langeberg Municipality has escalated water restrictions to Level 2 in accordance with the Langeberg Drought Management Policy.

Level 2 water restrictions will be implemented with effect from 1 February 2026 and will apply to all towns within the Langeberg Municipal Area.

Dam Levels

Our key water sources, especially the dams in Robertson, are at critically low levels. A

As of 02 February 2026, Dassieshoek Dam is at just 1% and Kooskok Dam at 3%, compared to 100% in both on 31 January 2025.

In McGregor, Vaal Dam has dropped to 8%, down from 93% this time last year, the Rooi Dam is currently 47% compared to 88% last year, the Drinkwater Dam has dropped to 8% from 87% the previous year.

Key Contributing Factors

The key contributing factors are exceptionally low rainfall, increasing water use, high temperatures and the ongoing impacts of climate change.

Revised Water Tariffs Effective 1 February 2026

Revised water tariffs linked to Level 2 restrictions take effect from 1 February 2026. A 100% increase applies to residential use and a 20% increase to non-residential use once monthly consumption exceeds 15 kilolitres.

LEVEL 2 WATER RESTRICTIONS IMPLEMENTED ACROSS THE LANGEBERG MUNICIPAL AREA FROM 1 FEBRUARY 2026 (CONTINUED)

WATER RESTRICTION MEASURES AND USAGE GUIDELINES FOR LEVEL 2

No application for relief from these restrictions will be granted to any individual or business.

Residential Water Use

- No leiwat.
- No watering of gardens using municipal water is permitted.
- No filling of swimming pools is allowed.
- No washing of vehicles using any hosepipe is permitted.
- Reuse grey water from baths, showers and laundry to flush toilets, wash vehicles, clean floors and water gardens.

Sports Fields and Recreational Facilities

- No watering of sports fields, cricket pitches, golf course greens and/or bowling greens is permitted.
- This restriction does not apply if an alternative, non-municipal water source is used.

Commercial and Industrial Water Use

- Commercial car wash businesses are prohibited from washing vehicles using any hosepipe.
- Consultation with bulk consumers in the industrial and business sectors, as identified through the billing system.

Penalties and Enforcement

- A penalty applicable for non-adherence to the water restriction measures as provided above will be issued.
- The penalty as listed in the tariffs is R 3 931.72 (VAT Excl.) per incidence of non-adherence.
- The 100% increase in tariffs for monthly consumption in excess of 15 kilolitre per month per household connection, including indigent households, is according to Section 75 A of the Systems Act. Stricter policing and implementation of a complaint line.
- Installation of flow restrictors to consumers that are non-compliant to the restrictions as well as customers with continued high water consumption.
- All reported incidents will be investigated and followed up accordingly.

If consumption does not decrease significantly, Level 3 restrictions may be implemented.

The Municipality encourages all residents to practice responsible water use daily to ensure sustainable water management and help combat the effects of climate change.





ROBERTSON PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL CLOSED FROM 2 FEBRUARY 2026, DUE TO LEVEL 2 WATER RESTRICTIONS

Langeberg Municipality acknowledges the concerns raised by residents regarding the temporary closure of municipal swimming pools following the implementation of Level 2 Water Restrictions, effective 2 February 2026.

The decision to close municipal swimming pools was not taken lightly. It forms part of a broader set of compulsory water-saving measures introduced to protect our critically limited water resources and ensure continued access to water for essential household, health, and emergency needs.

Under Level 2 Water Restrictions, the filling or refilling of swimming pools using municipal water is prohibited. Municipal swimming pools require large volumes of water not only to fill them, but also to:

- Maintain safe hygiene and water quality
- Replace water lost through evaporation
- Conduct routine cleaning and backwashing of filtration systems

Given the extremely low dam levels across the Langeberg Municipal Area — some as low as 2% to 10% — the continued operation of public pools would place additional strain on already depleted water supplies.

Water restrictions apply equally to all residents, facilities, and municipal operations. Closing municipal swimming pools demonstrates that the Municipality is:

- Leading by example
- Applying restrictions fairly
- Prioritising essential water use over recreational use

The Municipality urges all residents to continue using water responsibly to help safeguard the supply for everyone and to reduce the risk of further restrictions.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding as we work together to protect our water resources.

MID-YEAR REPORT 2025/2026

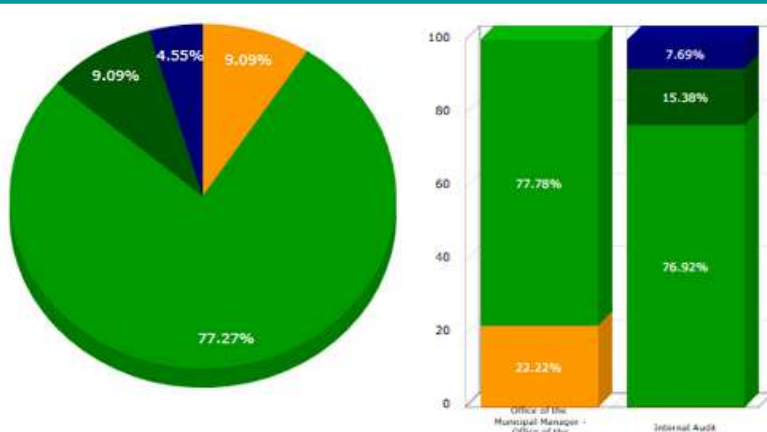

- The bar chart on the right offers a detailed breakdown of departmental performance within the directorate, giving residents a clear view of how individual departments are progressing.

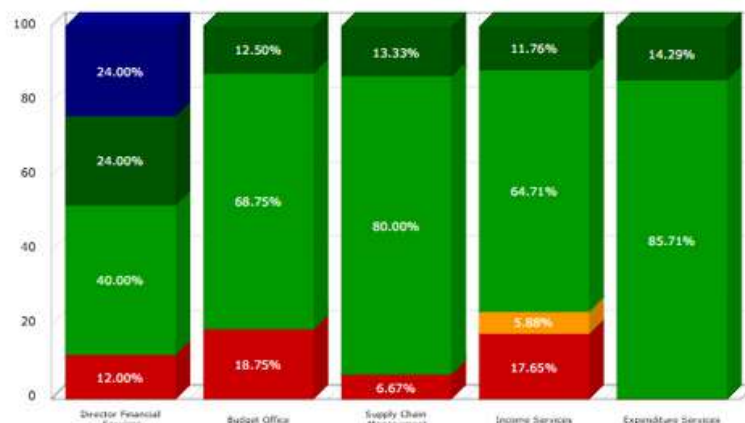
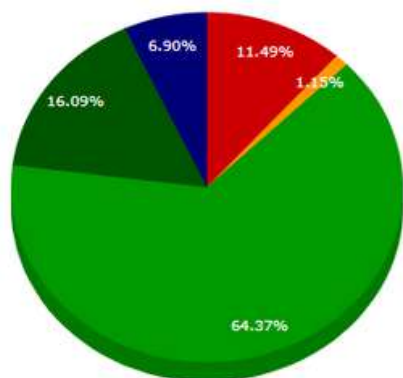

Your attendance and participation are important, as community input helps guide municipal planning, prioritisation of projects, and decision-making processes.

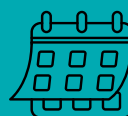
